## **Kappa State Education Foundation Announces 2022 Grant Recipients**

Congratulations to the recipients of the Education Foundation Grants for October 2022. The Foundation has selected six winners this year who will be using their money for a variety of projects and programs to enhance learning in their classrooms, in their schools, and in their communities.

### The winners this year are:

**AREA 1:** Hannah Campbell is a second grade teacher in Harrison and a member of Chi Chapter. Her project is "Windows, Mirrors, and Sliding Glass Doors". She will use her grant to purchase more books for her classroom library. After learning about her student's interests she will be able to diversify her books so that each of her students can find characters they can relate to while reading.

**AREA 2:** Jennifer Chism teaches third grade at Maumelle Charter Elementary School. She is a member of Theta Chapter in Conway. Sometimes Jennifer can have as many as 26 students in her classroom. Keeping supplies and textbooks organized and easily accessible for her students is sometimes challenging. She will use her grant money to purchase seat sacks to go on the back of each student's chair to help them organize their supplies and textbooks.

**AREA 3:** President Amy Simpson and the Gamma Rho Chapter submitted an application to continue their service project with the Dolly Parton Imagination Library. They have been sponsoring that project with the help of their members since September, 2021. With this grant they will expand to include funding for 60 more students. Gamma Rho Chapter will look forward to seeing what a difference this project can make in the lives of children in the community of Jonesboro.

**AREA 4:** Dana Cox, President of Alpha Delta Chapter, submitted a grant application called "Project Bookcase". This is an outreach ministry between the First United Methodist Church of Hope and the Clinton Primary School. The partnership builds small bookcases, fills them with books, and gives them to struggling readers in first grade during May. These students will then have extra books to read during the summer months. To assist with this project Alpha Delta Chapter members will bring books to each meeting during the year to help fill the bookcases in May.

**At Large: Area 1** Shonda Johnson from the Beta Nu Chapter in Russellville applied for a grant to be able to secure a Decodable Reader Library. Their school is part of the R.I.S.E. Arkansas Reading Initiative committed to building stronger readers. Teachers would be able to check out a set of the decodable readers and use them in their small group instruction. This project would benefit the entire school population of 530 students.

At Large: Area 4 Tanya Fox of Alpha Delta Chapter applied for funds to be able to purchase items for what they call their "Calm Down Corner". This is a new requirement by the school district. The purpose of the "corner" is to provide a safe space for a child to go when their emotions are high, and they need a time to quiet their mind. In this space they would find a cozy place, with guides to calming down, whether it be books, blankets, fidgets, or soothing bottles. These corners are considered a safe zone for the students as they deal with their emotions.

Thank you to all who applied this year and we encourage others to be ready to submit an application next year.

### Highlights of the Arkansas State Organization Fall Meeting

The ASO Fall Meeting was held on Saturday, October 22, 2022 at the University of Arkansas/Pulaski Tech campus in North Little Rock. The theme for this year's meeting was "Dream Big." Members arrived starting at 8:30 am and immediately the flow of greetings and ideas began! The meeting began officially with a welcome from ASO President Sue Cook. The collect was led by ASO Secretary Claudia Smith. There were 53 members registered for the meeting and 49 in attendance.

The ASO Executive Board Business meeting was then called to order by ASO President Sue Cook. It was announced that the proposed site for the next ASO State Convention is the Ozark Folk Center in Mountain View. A group of ASO officers recently visited the site and were impressed with the reasonable prices and the facilities, including newly renovated and spacious hotel accommodations. A motion was made by the executive committee to have the ASO Convention on June 2-4, 2023 at the Ozark Folk Center. The motion carried. A motion was also made and approved for the Kappa State Education Foundation's giveaway of a Razorback theme basket during the meeting to raise funds for the foundation's grants. Tickets were given to members who donated to the foundation. The Non-Dues Revenue Committee also won approval to sell t-shirts and miscellaneous items left from other events to help pay for officer training.

Terri Leins-Smith made a report on the progress of writing the ASO History. Significant progress has been made with "milestones" that the committee has identified. Most important areas are completed. Following Terri's update the business portion of the meeting was adjourned.

Several important announcements were then made. Nominations Committee Chair Darlene Emmons shared that the state officer nomination form would be sent to chapter presidents December 5, 2022. She asked that each chapter president make their members aware of the opportunity to nominate someone (with the person's permission) for an ASO office. The forms will also be available on the ASO website. The nominations forms are due by January 15, 2023.

Cissy Pendergrass, filling in for Awards Chairman Cathy Long, reminded members that award nominations are due back by February 1, 2023. Those forms are on the ASO website. Cards with the web address and information about the International website and the ASO website were passed out to chapter presidents at the meeting by 2nd Vice President Janie Hickman. The cards have a QR code along with instructions and passwords.

Featured speakers for the morning were the Sheridan High School Robotics Team. Team Sponsor Mr. Broadway brought two members of the team and their current robot. The team placed 11th nationally during their last competition. The students told members about the goals of a competition. They also shared other aspects of the contest work. They described how computer code has to be written to make the robot work alone for a certain amount of time. The coding makes the robot perform tasks like throwing a disc.

Following the robotics demonstration, ASO members were invited to network with other members present and buy tickets etc. When this allotted time finished, members of the Revitalization Committee shared some of the results of that meeting held during the summer.

Just before lunch there were two technology breakout sessions for members to choose between. Jackie Phillips presented "Navigating the DKG International Website" and Heather Dunn presented "Using Technology to Market DKG".

A wonderful lunch followed the introduction of the ASO officers and inspirational thoughts presented by ASO Immediate Past President Cathy

After the meal the members of the Ella Reese Leadership Seminar Class of 2022 were recognized and presented with a pin and the gift of a special tote bag by Leadership Chairman Pam Posey and Cathy Toney. Next Parliamentarian Candi Martin talked about the DKG International Convention in New Orleans and 2nd Vice President Janie Hickman showed a video and shared more details about the Ozark Folk Center and the upcoming 2023 State Convention.

The afternoon session of the fall meeting started with some additional networking time. This time the members present were divided into grade level groups for sharing of experiences. Both retired and active teachers participated.

The agenda for the day continued with a presentation by the Sheridan Elementary School Leadership Team. Principal Lindsey Bohler and Jaylyn Caldwell discussed the team's experiences with a Professional Learning Community (PLC) during this final whole group session. It is a system that has greatly improved the pace and quality of learning in their school.


